ANNOUNCEMENTS

Council extended congratulations to the following:

EXPENDITURE HIGHLIGHTS

Highlights of Council expenditures included:

BUDGET 2021

Council unanimously approved the 2021 Budget and Tax Structure. There were no increases in tax rates.

CAPITAL WORKS UPDATE

The CAO(A) contacted the Department of Environment, Climate Change and Municipalities and learned that the SAG grant does not cover water filtration systems. The CAO(A) will explore other funding source possibilities. The application for the Clarke's Pond Capital Works Project has been with government since September 29thawaiting approval to go to tender. Mayor Power is pursuing meetings with Ministers Bragg and Bennett to discuss the project and address delays.

SNOW CLEARING

Council would like to remind all residents that on-street parking is prohibited between the hours of midnight and 10:00AM for the period of December 1st to March 31st in order to effectively carry out snow clearing activities. Also, for safety reasons, the dumping of snow from driveways onto public roadways will not be tolerated. The Town has been authorized by the Provincial Government to issue summary offence tickets for such infraction. Damages to personal property (fences, garbage boxes etc.) due to the accumulation of snow is not the responsibility of the Town or contractor. Residents are asked to keep their garbage boxes free of snow to allow for safe waste collection.

UNITY PARC

The Town was awarded the Special Assistance Grant funding for the arena in the amount of \$10,000 from the provincial government in response to covid-19.

CONVENT UPDATE

The Culture, Tourism and Beautification Committee met with Father Jose and members of Our Lady of Angels Parish Finance Committee to discuss the Convent land. Discussion was positive and the Committee is optimistic that the land will be turned over to the Town which would be a major milestone and step closer to restoring the property.



PERMITS

Council approved the following permits:

WEST WHITE ROSE PROJECT

Government recently announced 41.5 million in funding for the West White Rose project from the Oil and Gas Sector. The project was suspended until 2022. The Town is hopeful that the project will restart and is waiting to see how it will unfold.
