- \$6,207.77 for two radar signs
- \$8,800.00 shipping and taxes included for the purchase of a skate sharpener for Unity PARC
- \$33.00 per month to maintain electricity to two poles located in the Legacy Garden that were formerly paid for by the Eastern School District.
- \$45,000 to Architect 49 for owner advisor work completed to date on the Wellness Centre project.

# **PORT OF ARGENTIA TAX AGREEMENT**

The Town of Placentia and Port of Argentia have signed a new tax agreement. The tax agreement negotiations began in late 2017 and concluded in December 2019. The agreement will cover the taxation years 2018-2022 inclusive. It will also include continuation of the Access Agreement that was initially approved in 2007, in which the Town accepted responsibility to provide municipal services to Argentia. Mayor Power and Chairperson Burge are pleased that both parties arrived at an agreement that will bring fair taxation

revenue to the Town of Placentia. The Town anticipates receiving approximately \$3 million over the 5-year term of the agreement. The Port of Argentia has always been and will continue to be an important economic driver for the Placentia area providing both direct and indirect employment and benefits. Chairperson Burge stated that the Port appreciates the efforts of both parties in arriving at a mutual agreement and commended the negotiating representatives on both sides for working tirelessly to reach common ground. Mayor Power stated that both the Town of Placentia and Port of Argentia are eager to improve the working relationship with each other and all community stakeholders to further develop and grow the Placentia area.

## **PUBLIC WORKS WINTER ISSUES**

The Public Works Superintendent is investigating a number of complaints regarding damages to garbage boxes. The Committee asked that residents be reminded to keep their garbage boxes free of ice and snow to allow for easier collection and protection of their garbage boxes from heavy snow build up. The Committee also discussed the importance of continuing with snow removal from all hydrants and thanked those residents, who have aided Public Works after heavy snowfalls. The Committee discussed the importance of protecting the water shed area and will be erecting more signage outlining what is not permitted and enforcing same.

#### ON-STREET PARKING BAN CONTINUES

The Town reminds all residents, on-street parking is prohibited between the hours of 12:00AM and 10:00AM for the period of December 1<sup>st</sup> to March 31<sup>st</sup> in order to effectively carry out snow clearing activities. Also, for safety reasons, the dumping of snow from driveways onto public roadways will not be tolerated.

The Town has been authorized by the Provincial Government to issue summary offense tickets for such infractions. Please note damages to personal property (fences, garbage boxes etc.) due to the accumulation of snow are not the responsibility of the Town or its contractor. Residents are asked to keep their garbage boxes free of snow to allow for safe waste collection.
