CAPITAL WORKS

The Dunville Water Connection & Connection of Three Ponds Project is ready for award pending review of tender submissions. The award of the contract is expected in the next couple of days. The tendering process is dictated by provincial guidelines and is managed by consulting engineers.

The current capital works project has an additional scope of work to address any water shortages as it will connect 3 additional sources to Clarke's pond supply. Gull Pond, Barron's Pond and Little Barron's Pond will be connected by piping to Clarke's pond in order to make up for the additional demand of adding the Dunville system to Clarke's Pond. This project scope was created based on the recommendations of professional engineers.

WATER COLOUR

Currently the Town has limited ability to remove colour from water as disinfection occurs without a water treatment plant. Weather such as heavy rain and high winds greatly impacts water colour and can have a lasting effect as it takes time to turn over large water supplies. Colour is identified as an aesthetic concern in water treatment but can be an indicator of issues such as large water main break if concerns are in isolated areas. The current colour issues are throughout the Town and are related to the water supply. Additional line flushing is scheduled and water quality should improve as ice has formed on our water supplies. The Town is also engaging consultants to see if there are other factors or solutions that can be addressed to improve water colour. The Town is hopeful that all efforts and weather conditions will bring improved water colour quickly.

WINTER CARNIVAL

This year's winter carnival will expand beyond a one week period to offer the community a number of pop up events and activities. Residents are encouraged to follow the Town's social media to participate for a chance to win random carnival prize draws!

- -Garnishment of Rental Income
- -Collection Agency Referral
