EXPENDITURE HIGHLIGHTS

Highlights of Council expenditures included:

- \$5,648.66 including HST to rebuild a lift station pump
- \$1,000 to the Placentia Area Historical Society to assist with renovations at St. Luke's Church
- \$1000 donation to the Placentia & Area Food Bank
- \$4,558.68 plus HST per year on a 36-month lease for renewal of Everbridge for the Placentia Aware Notification System
- \$125 per month on a 66-month lease renewal of Neopost for postage meter from Modern Equipment
- \$2,500 to the Men's Recreation Hockey League to promote
 French culture during hockey tournament

OTHER APPROVALS

- CAO to modify the existing terms of the P4 Agreement to include amended dates and timelines to move forward with the development.
- CAO to negotiate purchase of the parking lot and garden in Town Square owned by the Episcopal Corporation.
- Town accepted bid of \$2,000 for sale of the 2010 Chev Acadia.
- Town to make application for Multi Year Capital Works funding in the amount of \$5,000,000 to continue the Freshwater Water Line project.
- \$60,000 approved for purchase of playground equipment for the Jerseyside playground from gas tax funding.


