Council extended congratulations to:

EXPENDITURE HIGHLIGHTS

PERMITS

Council approved the following permits:

- Three accessory building permits
- Six building extension permits
- One general repairs permit

Council amended the permit application requirements for fences and accessory buildings to read that the **surveys are preferred, but if not available, a detailed drawing outlining all dimensions of the development, dimensions of any existing structures and all side yard distances may be accepted.**

CAPITAL WORKS PROJECTS

Council agreed to apply for ICIP funding for the following required infrastructure upgrades: (1) Dunville Watermain Project; (2) Old Settlement Hill Storm Drainage; (3) Shore Erosion on Battery Road and Harbour Drive from Hurricane Larry.

Council agreed to apply for Multi Year Capital Works funding program for the following projects: (1) Freshwater Sewer Outfall/Upgrades; (2) Harbour Drive Storm Drainage; (3) Regatta Grounds Lift Station.

Council agreed to apply for Disaster Mitigation funding for Hurricane Larry damage along the shoreline of Jersey side and repairs and installation of armour stone on Harbour Drive.

AWARD OF TENDER

Council approved award of tender for #PW-ITT-06 Arena Supply and Installation of Insulation to Skyline Contracting Ltd. in the amount of \$22,770 including HST.

COVID-19

Effective October 22, 2021 access to Unity PARC and the Placentia Bay Cultural Arts Centre will require proof of vaccination and an ID. Any users of the arena between the hours of 8AM and 3PM will have to call the arena attendant to enter the building. After 3PM weekdays, during weekends and during peak usage times there will be attendant at the door to scan and confirm eligibility to enter. Youth 18 and under are exempt and are not required to scan. Patrons must call the arena during off peak times for access at 709-227-3996.
